

Academic Standards Committee (ASC) Annual Report for General Faculties Council 2023-2024

Colleagues

I am happy to provide the annual report of the Academic Standards Committee for 20230-2024. The ASC met 6 times to review and approved 7 program reviews. Now that MRU has been given audit status by CAQC, Academic Standards gives final approval in the quality assurance process, with the Executive Summary provided to General Faculties Council for information.

SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES AND OUTCOMES

Academic Standards Committee reviewed and approved the following Program Reviews:

- Bachelor of English(ENGL)
- Bachelor of PolicyStudies(POST)
- Bachelor of Sociology(SLGY)
- Bachelor of Accounting(ACCT)+AdvancedAccountingCertificate
- Bachelor of Midwifery
- Bachelor of Marketing(MKTG)

Other Work

The ASC also reviewed and, where appropriate, recommended the following to GFC:

- The *Comprehensive Institutional Plan* to understand what role, if any, the ASC might have in relation to the *Plan*
- The *Tenure and Promotion Handbook* required updating and Dr. Sabrina Reed, Professor, Department of English was commissioned to make a number of editorial changes to update the *Handbook*. With agreement from both the Association and the University, a new section was added to provide guidance for senior lecturers and lab instructors to achieve permanency. The ASC recommended the updated document, now entitled *The Tenure, Permanency and Promotion Handbook*, v3 to GFC in January. GFC approved the new Handbook and it is now in use.
- The Academic Program Review Policy and Procedures. The Policy does require programs to provide an update midway through its advancement plan and that update is provided to ASC for information.
- A revised *Admissions Policy* (with a provision that English proficiency scores required for admission be reported to ASC annually)
- Addition of a representative from the Faculty of Continuing Education to the Committee

Acknowledgement of Indigenous Perspectives in the Institutional Tenure and Promotion Criteria

• The ASC Working Group continued its work consulting with INdigenous faculty, including the Indigenous Faculty Collective, Provost Council and Faculty Councils to arrive a final text for Appendix D-Acknowledging Indigenous Perspectives in the *Institutional Tenure and Promotion Criteria*, which ASC has recommended to General Faculties Council. Once the Board of Governors approves *Appendix D*, the *MOU on Acknowledging Indigenous Ways of Knowing* will be complete.

MATTERS FOR FUTURE CONSIDERATION

Looking ahead, the Academic Standards Committee notes:

- The coming academic year looks to be very busy with 10 program reviews anticipated to be examined (subject to change):
- BComm Information Design
- B.Education + B. Ed. MHC collaborative degree
- B. Criminal Justice
- BComm Journalism and Digital Media Studies
- BA Anthropology
- BBA Human Resources + Adv. HR Certificate,
- BSc Geology (moved from F23 to W24), with site visit dates: Oct 7 & 8
- B. Computer Information Systems, with site visit dates: Oct 31 & Nov 1
- BA Psychology
- Adv. Studies in Critical Care Nursing Certificate

Other Work Ahead

- The ASC began to consider a recommendation from the MRFA that the number of peer evaluations for tenurable faculty be changed. This request has led to ASC to consider arriving at a process to amend the *Tenure and Promotion Handbook* going forward.
- Given the importance of maintaining academic standards with the challenges of artificial intelligence, the ASC looks forward to addressing any recommendations from the AI and Teaching and Learning Working Group.
- We will continue to refine the review approval process as required.
