General Education & Elective Requirements

Completion of General Education and elective requirements is flexible in your overall plan of study. These courses may be taken as recommended above or in other academic semesters dependent on course availability and student workload (e.g. Spring semester). If you require full-time status (three courses per semester, 9 credits) for any reason (funding, health care, etc.), save at least one requirement for the Winter semester in Year 4, as there are only two INDS courses in the final semester.

Students in the Bachelor of Interior Design are required to complete ten (10) General Education requirements.

Four (4) Foundation Tier courses, one from each cluster

Three (3) General Education courses from Tier 2 including one (1) Art History (ARTH) from Cluster 2

Three (3) General Education courses from Tier 3 including one (1) Art History (ARTH) from Cluster 2*

Students must complete one (1) 3 credit elective requirement of their choice at any level.

stIt is highly recommended to complete the Art History Cluster 2 Tier 3 requirement before entering 4th year.
