If the student opts out of this agreement prior to the first day of classes in September student's honours year this agreement is considered void and they must reapply for a the Honours Program in Psychology.	

If the student is registered in Psychology 5110 and after the first day of classes in September of the student's honours year they are unable to meet thesis progression requirements as a result of medical, compassionate, or other legitimate reasons consistent with Mount Royal University Academic Regulations, the Department of Psychology will ensure that the student is able to complete a thesis project in a subsequent academic term(s), though not necessarily with the supervisor named above, and the thesis topic may need modification or change.

If the supervisor is unable to fulfill their supervisory duties as a result of medical, compassionate, or professional reasons during the term of this agreement, the Department of Psychology will place the student with another faculty member from the department in order for them to complete the thesis project in a timely manner.

In acknowledging the collaborative nature of the honours thesis, and in accordance with APA Guidelines (Article 1.13), the student and supervisor must discuss and each verify in writing any form of dissemination of the research findings prior to the submission of the work. This includes dissemination both internal and external to Mount Royal University.

PSYC 3305: History of Psychology

PSYC 4405: Psychometrics

PSYC 4410: Introduction to Qualitative Research Methods for Psychology

* Note: These courses are numbered among the Psychology courses taken to complete the BA in Psychology, so the total number of Psychology courses taken should not exceed 24, the maximum number of Psychology courses permitted in the BA Psychology program.
