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Understanding the Meaning of Psychological Harm Experienced by Undergraduate Nursing Students in Simulation"

1.1 Project Summary

Undergraduate nursing students who engage in simulation-based learning may experience psychological harm. Gadamer's philosophical hermeneutics was used to explore the meaning of psychological harm experienced by undergraduate nursing students during simulation. A purposive sample was used to recruit nine students who were enrolled in the baccalaureate nursing program at Mount Royal University. Data collection involved conducting semi-structured interviews and the data was analyzed using the interpretive method of hermeneutics.

1.2 Project Outcomes and Impacts

Findings from this research revealed a range of responses from psychological harm, and that peer support may assist with navigating emotional distress. Psychological harm has the potential to impact students' engagement and learning in the debrief and clinical environment. Participants' experiences emphasized increased hesitance to accept subsequent leadership roles during simulation and uncertainty relative to future career choices. This study highlighted that psychological harm in simulation may influence students' experiential learning and future simulation experiences.

This project has informed next steps and future research that will explore the processes undergraduate nursing students use to make meaning of their experiences of psychological harm in simulation.
